### **Pistol:**

#### **AN IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT!**

Because of continued major range infractions by a select few members, effective immediately, **THERE WILL BE NO RIFLES, SHOT GUNS OR RIFLE CALIBER PISTOLS ON THE PISTOL RANGE!** No 22 rim fire rifles, no .223 caliber pistols, no rifle caliber single shot pistols such as a Contender or an XP-100, no shot gun shells for pistols, no pistol caliber carbines, period. The only exception to this is a supervised event. If you have a question if it's allowed on the pistol range, don't use it and contact myself or Gary Lavigne. Steve Ouellette

### **22LR Two Gun Match Results – June 19th:**

Despite a seemingly unending cold and wet spring, the weather cooperated for the match held on Sunday, June 19th. ### **Pending new state record brown trout:**

## Rifle / Pistol:

### Range Safety

As a reminder on all newsletters. The ranges are designed so that the targets NEED to be placed on the HOMOSOTE! NOT UNDER, NOT OVER, NOT ON THE OUTER EDGE, BUT ON THE HOMOSOTE!

No steel targets unless shooting at the fixed targets provided. You cannot bring your own steel targets, commercially available targets or stands. NO EXPLODING TARGETS. No placing glass or plastic cans, dinner plates – plastic or china, glass jars, glass bottles, bowling pins, or spent cartridges on the berm or on the ground to shoot at. These ranges are designed to keep the bullets on our property. Please keep this in mind when shooting on our ranges. Please REMEMBER RANGE SAFETY! **Found 38 special Dud's in the trash I emptied in the Dumpster suspect Williams reloads. Please place the miss fires in the proper containers (Red containers under the Pistol and Rifle Ranges cover). Do not place duds into the trash.**

**Only paper, food wrappers, water containers and old paper targets are to be placed into the trash receptacles.**

**Note: Penetrators (Armor piecing) rifle rounds are not to be used on the poppers (prairie dogs). Even these plates are hardened to 500 Brinell hardness; the armor piercing rounds will destroy the prairie dogs and spoil it for others who do not shoot the penetrators. Please do not use armor piecing ammo.**

### Range Rules

Now that the warmer weather is here this would be a good time for a quick reminder of some of the range rules:

If you are going down range, you need to clear your gun, activate the horn, and turn on the safety light. It does not matter if you are the only person there. If you're down range, the lights are on.

There is absolutely no shooting from in front of the benches. There are enough targets placed closer than 25 yards.

The only targets approved for either ranges are **PAPER TARGETS** of steel targets installed by the Rifle/ Pistol committee. That means **NO PERSONAL STEEL TARGET, regardless if they are homemade or commercially manufactured.** No bowling pins, soda cans, bottles, computer monitor's, bullet proof vest, exploding targets etc. If Gary Lavigne or myself have not approved the target, don't bring it. Case Closed!

**(Range Rules are POSTED at RANGES – please read)**

Let's have a safe and enjoyable shooting season!

Please clean up paper targets, brass, shot shells, and garbage that are brought to the pange. Brooms and dust shovels are provided. Cleanup after shooting for the next person – TAKE PRIDE.

**Sat Aug 6      Falling Plates Centerfire Pistol +.22 Rifle. 10Am – 3Pm**

Firearms: Centerfire Handgun (No Magnums) & .22LR Rifle Classes: Iron Sight shoots 1 less than the number of plates as the Optic/Electronic Sights.:

This Shoot is one of our most popular shoots and is held every first Saturday of the month. The course consists of 2 plate racks with 5 plates. The center plate is painted red and is the stop plate. Two shooters will then go to the shooting line and begin at the low ready position and at the horn will shoot all 5 plates. The winner is the first one to shoot his or her plates down first. We will shoot 7 or 5 relays like this to develop a win/loss record and then we will split shooters into an A and B squad. Then the shooters will shoot for double elimination until the last two shooters. Classification is as follows. Optics are allowed. If one shooter is shooting Iron sights and the other has an optic then the shooter shooting iron may shoot down a plate before the horn. If both shooters have optics or iron sights, the shooters will shoot all 5 plates. We will shoot a center fire Pistol Match first and then shoot a .22 LR Rifle Match second.

**Sun Aug 14      22LR Action Match - 2 Gun. 10Am – 3Pm**

Firearms: 22LR Pistol and 22LR Rifle

Sights: Either Open or Optic Sights are permitted on either pistols or rifles. Note that only Open Sight pistols will be given a one plate advantage when competing against an Optic Sight pistol.

The actual course of action for the match is not being announced till the day of the match. Please bring extra magazines for the 22LR pistols and rifles also with lots of ammo.

This event has grown in popularity and can be a lot of fun. New shooters are encouraged to come and practice safe use of pistols and rifles in a friendly atmosphere with fellow shooting enthusiasts.

**Sun Aug 21      3 Gun Match; 10Am – 3Pm**

Firearms: CF Pistol, Shotgun (Birdshot ≤6 lead birdshot) and CF Rifle

Classes: Iron and Optic/Electronic based on Pistol Sights: Iron and

Optic/Electronic Targets: Paper and Steel 10-100 yards

Cold range rules:

All weapons are to be unloaded prior to the commencement of the match.

Loading/Unloading of firearms will be performed only under the direction of a Range Officer. All handguns must be unloaded, hammer down and holstered at ALL TIMES, except when directed to load and shoot a stage by a range officer. Tables for stages where shooters who do not have a holsters will be provided. Long guns must be unloaded and cased, or unloaded with action open and carried muzzle down range, except when directed to load and shoot a stage by a range officer. Safe areas for gun handling will be provided on each range. A safe area is expressly provided for the unsupervised handling of firearms and may be used by anyone at any time. No ammunition will be allowed at any time in a safe area.

Description of the match?

This is a three gun tactical match. It will utilize rifle, shotgun, and handgun. The stages will not be published prior to the match. These stages will strive to present realistic use of the firearms involved, as needed in a tactical environment. The stages will attempt to portray a defensive or offensive situation.

How many stages of fire?

There may be five to six stages, but at least 3. There may be stages where more than one firearm is used.

What kind of handgun, rifle and shotgun will I need?

HANDGUN: Any safe and serviceable handgun of a minimum caliber of 9mm/.38Special.

RIFLE: Any serviceable and safe center fire rifle. Semi-autos, bolt actions, lever actions etc. will compete evenly.

Slings may be used, but must remain on the rifle at all times. We will attempt to set up a course of fire that tests the operator more than the equipment. But realistically, semi-autos will usually be easier to use in any action scenario. Ranges will be from as close as 10 yards to as far as 100 yards.

SHOTGUN: Any serviceable and safe shotgun, a minimum of 20 gauge, may be used.

You may only use one handgun, one shotgun, and one rifle during the match.

**Sun Aug 28 Service Military Rifle Shoot Match also with pre-1945 Military Rifle; 10Am – 3Pm**

On Sunday Aug 28, beginning at 10 AM, Rockville F&G will be hosting TWO bull's-eye military rifle matches. One of the matches will allow only rifles (and civilian reproductions) of a type issued by ANY nation's military before 1945 and will prohibit optical sights.

The other match will all include military rifles (and their civilian reproductions of military rifles) of any era and will allow the use of optics suitable for the rifle.

Minor modifications, including sporterizing will be allowed in both matches.

Bipods will be prohibited, but slings may be used at any time during the match.

The targets for both matches will be bull's-eye targets at 100 yards with the following times allowed.

10 rounds standing offhand in 6 minutes

5 rounds kneeling (or standing if you prefer) in 3 minutes

5 rounds sitting in 3 minutes (if physical limitations prevent this, you may sit on a stool, but not rest your elbows on anything)

10 rounds in 6 minutes from the prone position (try to bring a mat to lay on)

Have your rifles sighted in and kinks worked out prior to coming to the match as there won't be time to do it match day. DO NOT bring a rifle with a hair trigger or any other safety issues.

Since the shooting times are generous, manual action rifles will not be at a disadvantage against semi-autos. There is even enough time for single shot rifles, such as the trapdoor Springfield.

Muzzle loaders will be prohibited at both matches.

No fully automatic weapons may be used on the range.

Rifles are to be brought to the range and firing line cased and unloaded.

As always, eye and hearing protection is required for all shooters and spectators.

**Sat Sep 3 Falling Plates Centerfire Pistol+ Shotgun. Match Director: Dennis A. and Jim F. 10Am – 3Pm**

Firearms: Centerfire Handgun (No Magnums) & Shotgun Classes: Iron Sight centerfire pistols and pump shotguns shoots 1 less than the number of plates as the Optic/Electronic Sights or semi-auto shotguns.

Shotgun – birdshot size  $\leq 6$  lead birdshot (no steel birdshot).

This Shoot is one of our most popular shoots and is held every first Saturday of the month. The course consists of 2 plate racks with 5 plates. The center plate is painted red and is the stop plate. Two shooters will then go to the shooting line and begin at the low ready position and at the horn will shoot all 5 plates. The winner is the first one to shoot his or her plates down first. We will shoot 7 or 5 relays like this to develop a win/loss record and then we will split shooters into an A and B squad. Then the shooters will shoot for double elimination until the last two shooters. Classification is as follows. Optics are allowed. 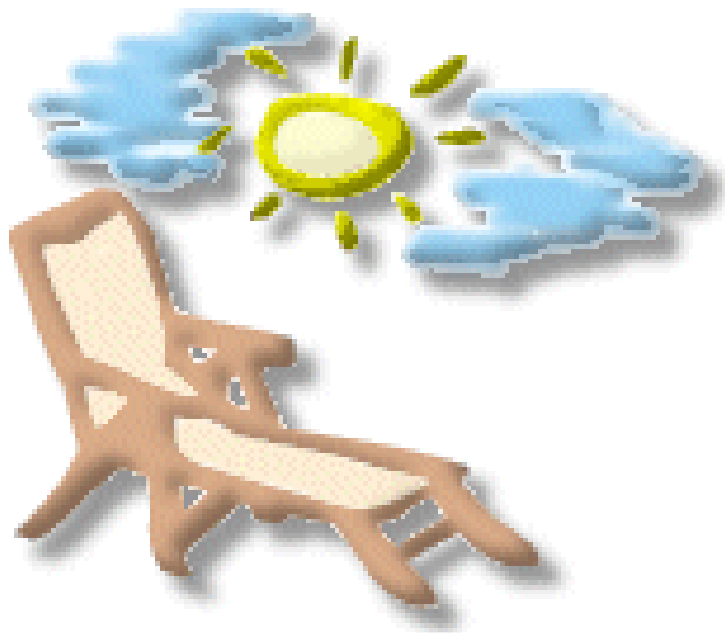
